## **Ideological Composition of House Committees (116th Congress)**

Last updated December 1, 2020

Seats on the 23 House committees in the 116th Congress<sup>1</sup> are divided between Democrats and Republicans according to House rules, which party is in the majority, and the size of that majority. However, allocating seats proportionately to each party does not account for ideological diversity within each party. Some committees are stacked with the House's most progressive and conservative members. Others are filled with mostly centrists.

The Congressional Progressive Caucus Center has analyzed how members of major ideological caucuses in the House are distributed across committees in the 116th Congress. While members of ideological causes have differences among themselves, the caucuses provide a decent approximation of members' ideology relative to other members of their party.

## Major Ideological Caucuses (from left to right)

<u>Congressional Progressive Caucus</u> (**CPC**): The CPC consists of 94 members, 39% of House Democrats, and stands "for progressive policies that prioritize working Americans over corporate interests, fight economic and social inequality, and advance civil liberties."

<u>New Democrat Coalition</u> (NDC): The NDC consists of 103 members, 43% of House Democrats, and identifies as "forward-thinking Democrats who are committed to pro-economic growth, pro-innovation, and fiscally responsible policies."

<u>Blue Dog Coalition</u> (BDC): The BDC consists of 26 members, 11% of the House Democrats, and describes itself as "dedicated to pursuing fiscally-responsible policies, ensuring a strong national defense, and transcending party lines to get things done for the American people."

<u>Problem Solvers Caucus</u>: The Problem Solvers Caucus is a bipartisan group consisting of 47 members, 25 Democrats and 22 Republicans, and accounts for 10% of House Democrats and 11% of House Republicans. It describes itself as "committed to finding common ground on many of the key issues facing the nation."

<u>Tuesday Group</u>: The Tuesday Group consists of 14 members, 7% of House Republicans, and is described as a center-right coalition.

Republican Study Committee (RSC): The RSC consists of 147 members, 74% of House Republicans, and pushes for a "principled legislative agenda that will limit government, strengthen our national defense, boost America's economy, preserve traditional values and balance our budget."

<u>Freedom Caucus</u>: The Freedom Caucus consists of 36 members, 18% of House Republicans, and advocates "for more conservative spending and policy ideals in the House."
